To identify a specific fiber, divide the fiber number by 12 to determine the tube, then use the remainder to find the fiber color within that tube. For example, Fiber #34 is the 10th fiber in the 3rd tube (Green Tube), which corresponds to Violet. Connector and Jacket Color Considerations Outer Jacket Colors: Indicate fiber type (e.g., Yellow for single-mode, Orange for OM1/OM2 multimode, Aqua for OM3/OM4 multimode) and help technicians quickly identify cable functionality. Connector Boots: Often match fiber type and polish (e.g., Blue for UPC single-mode, Green for APC single-mode, Beige for multimode) to prevent misconnection. Special Notes Some European or high-density cables may use a 16-color sequence for fibers 13-16 in MPO connectors: Olive, Magenta, Tan, Lime. The hierarchical system ensures error-free splicing and maintenance, even in dense installations, by providing a unique color combination for each fiber.
