Key considerations include:

- Location:** Place the subpanel near the area of new load, avoiding damp, hot, or obstructed spaces, and maintain at least 3 feet of clear working space in front of the panel.
- Feeder Wiring:** Use a four-wire feeder (two hots, one neutral, one ground) sized according to the subpanel's amperage and distance from the main panel. For long runs, calculate voltage drop to ensure proper voltage at the subpanel.
- Grounding:** Keep the neutral and ground separate in the subpanel. For detached structures, install a local grounding electrode system in addition to the feeder ground.
- Permits and Inspection:** Check local codes and obtain any required permits. A licensed inspector can confirm amperage ratings and code compliance.
