

Are cable trays allowed to be buried underground

The type of conduit used also affects the required burial depth; for example, non-metallic PVC conduit typically requires a minimum cover of 18 inches, while rigid metal conduit may allow shallower burial, such as 6 inches. Regulatory and Safety Considerations Compliance with standards is essential. In the U.S., the National Electrical Code (NEC) governs underground cable installations, specifying minimum burial depths, protective measures, and cable types suitable for direct burial. In the U.K., BS 7671 provides guidance on buried cable installation, including reference methods for protection, backfilling, and mechanical stress mitigation. Proper backfill, such as sand or fine aggregate, is recommended to cushion the cable and prevent damage from sharp objects or heavy loads.
