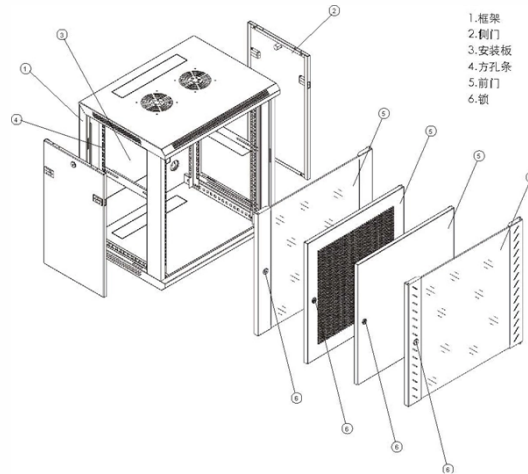


Broadband at the entrance electrical distribution box

Termination and Equipment At the entrance facility, broadband cables should terminate on patch panels, splice trays, or modular fiber management systems . This allows connection to structured cabling that distributes data throughout the building. For high-density installations, consider rack-mounted or wall-mounted fiber management systems to organize multiple service providers and future expansions . Electrical panels should remain dedicated to power distribution, with breakers, surge protection, and grounding properly installed .
