

Cascading Non-PoE Switches



AI Overview

PoE and non-PoE switches can be cascaded for data transmission, but only devices directly connected to a PoE switch will receive power. Connecting PoE and Non-PoE Switches You can connect a PoE switch to a non-PoE switch without issues for data transmission. The non-PoE switch will simply pass Ethernet data, but it cannot carry PoE power to downstream devices. PoE power is only delivered to devices directly connected to the PoE switch or through a PoE injector. Standard-compliant PoE switches detect whether a connected device supports PoE using a low-voltage signature detection process, ensuring non-PoE devices are not damaged.

Cascading Methods There are two common ways to cascade switches:

- Uplink Port Cascading:** Connect the uplink port of one switch to a normal port on another switch. Use a straight-through Ethernet cable, and ensure each cable segment does not exceed 100 meters. The PoE switch can then supply power to devices connected directly to it, while the non-PoE switch only handles data.
- Common Port Cascading:** Connect standard ports on both switches using a crossover or properly jumpered cable. This method also allows data to flow, but PoE will not pass through the non-PoE switch.

Power Considerations PoE devices (PDs) like IP cameras, VoIP phones, and wireless access points require a PoE source. If a non-PoE switch is placed between a PoE switch and a PD, the device will not receive power. Non-PoE devices connected to a PoE switch are safe; the switch will only transmit data and not power, provided it is an IEEE-standard PoE switch. Passive PoE switches that do not follow IEEE standards may continuously supply voltage, potentially damaging non-PoE devices.

Solutions for Mixed Networks Use a PoE injector to supply power to devices connected through a non-PoE switch. Ensure PoE switches are IEEE 802.3af/at/bt compliant to safely detect and power devices. For high-speed or high-power applications, consider directly connecting PoE devices to the PoE switch to avoid power loss or compatibility issue...
