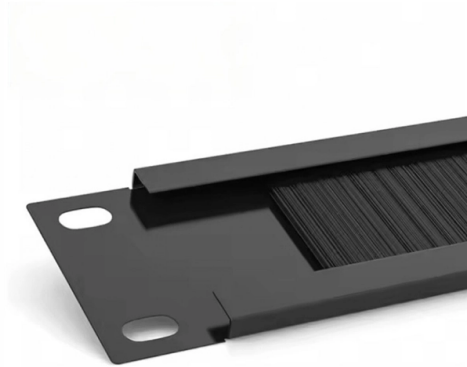


Construction distance around optical cable



Overview

After cable placement, approximately 2-3 meters of cable will be cut off each cable end to be assured that no fibers are encountered that were damaged from the placing operation. Where reels are supplied with protective material fitted over the cable, the protection should remain in place until the cable will be installed. During installation, all curvatures should be smooth. Turn-backs and all sharp changes of direction. Underground cables are pulled in conduit that is buried underground, usually 1-1.2 meters (3-4 feet) deep to reduce the likelihood of accidentally being dug up.
