Tertiary Distribution Box (Third Level): Also called the switch box, this is the final distribution point directly connected to electrical equipment. Each tertiary box usually controls one device or a group of similar devices. It contains isolation switches, circuit breakers, and leakage protectors to provide direct control and protection. Tertiary boxes can be fixed or movable, and they implement the principle of "one machine, one switch, one RCD, one box, one lock," ensuring that no single switch controls multiple devices, which enhances safety.
