- Apply Glue:** Inject epoxy or UV glue into the ferrule from the tail end until it slightly overflows.
- Cleaving the Fiber:** Strip the protective coating and cleave the fiber to the required length using a fiber cleaver.
- Insert Fiber into Ferrule:** Carefully insert the cleaved fiber into the ferrule, ensuring proper alignment.
- Crimping:** Use crimping pliers to secure the fiber within the ferrule.
- Attach the Boot and Housing:** Push the boot onto the ferrule and rotate the outer housing to tighten the threaded coupling, ensuring a firm connection.
- Curing and Polishing:** Cure the epoxy if used, and polish the ferrule end to achieve a smooth physical contact finish.
- Final Cleaning:** Clean the ferrule end with alcohol-soaked lint-free wipes and c...
