

Does the reinforcing core of indoor optical cable need to be grounded

Fiber optic cable transmits data as light through glass or plastic strands, which means the fiber core itself carries no electrical current and requires no grounding. Grounding conductor needs to be insulated, made of copper (or other corrosion resistant material), and stranded or solid. The size must be no smaller than 14 AWG and having an ampacity equal or larger
