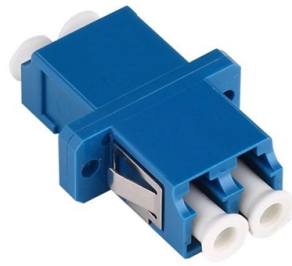


Even with the distribution box on there is still no power
