- ST (Straight Tip):** Features a bayonet lock and keyed ferrule to prevent rotation, often used in legacy networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector):** Screw-on type, typically used in high-vibration environments and multimode fibers.
- MPO/MTP (Multi-Fiber Push On):** High-density connectors capable of connecting multiple fibers simultaneously, commonly used in data centers and industrial environments.
- MT-RJ:** Compact duplex connector, mostly used with multimode cables in legacy systems.

End-Face Polishing Types

The connector end face affects signal quality and return loss:

- PC (Physical Contact):** Slightly curved end face to reduce air gaps, suitable for general data, video, and voice transmission.
- UPC (Ultra Physical Contact):** Enhanced polishing for higher return loss, ideal for 10G/25G SFP modules.
- APC (Angled Physical Contact):** Angled end face to minimize back reflection, commonly used in RF video and GPON networks.
