Flip the loops so the loose end is on top for the next pull.

Service Loops and Slack: Leave service loops at splice points, junctions, and equipment locations. These loops allow for future maintenance, repairs, or rerouting without replacing the entire cable run.

Aerial Installation: For strand-mounted or aerial cables, such as ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting) cables, ensure proper pole attachment, clearances, and tensioning. Minimum clearances from the ground and energized conductors must be observed (e.g., 18 feet above roads and 40 inches from power lines). Obtain necessary permits and coordinate with pole owners before installation. Lightweight fiber can sometimes be lashed to existing cables, but only with proper authorization.

Underground or Conduit Installation: When laying fiber in ducts or conduits, ensure the path is clear of sharp edges or obstacles. Use innerducts for protection and identification, and lubricate the cable to reduce pulling tension. Avoid vertical runs exceeding the max...
