- LC (Lucent Connector)** Miniaturized connector with a 1.25mm ferrule. Ideal for high-density applications like modern data centers. Uses a latch mechanism similar to RJ45 plugs, suitable for duplex or simplex configurations.
- SC (Subscriber/Standard Connector)** Square-shaped with a 2.5mm ferrule and push-pull mechanism. Common in FTTH deployments and legacy networks. SC/APC variants reduce return loss for RF video or GPON networks.
- ST (Straight Tip)** Bayonet-style twist-lock connector. Used in legacy systems, industrial, and military networks. Provides robust mechanical connections but is less common in modern networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector)** Threaded coupling for secure connections in high-vibration environments like factories or railways. APC polish reduces back reflection, suitable for precision applications.
- MPO/MTP (Multi-Fiber Push-On/Pull-off)** High-density connectors for backbone or data center cabling. Can connect multiple fibers simultaneously, supporting scalable network architectures.

The connector type determines compatibility with patch cables and network infrastructure: LC connectors are standard for most SFP modules. SC connectors are found in legacy SFP deployments.
