These components can be manually adjusted to maintain the tray's orientation and ensure a smooth transition without stressing the cables. If rung spacing is too tight, remove some rungs to allow proper bending and prevent cable damage. Safety and Best Practices Always follow local electrical codes and manufacturer guidelines for mounting and load limits. Use appropriate fasteners and ensure the wall can support the tray's weight. Avoid using the tray as a lifting point during handling or transport. For long runs, consider segmenting the tray and connecting sections with adjustable fittings to maintain alignment and prevent snapping back.
