- Phase Load Balancing:** In multi-phase systems, distribute loads evenly to avoid overheating and voltage imbalance.
- Select Correct Breaker Ratings:** Choose breakers that match the expected load of each circuit. Consider resistive, inductive, and capacitive loads, and include safety margins.
- Plan for Expansion:** Leave space for additional breakers to accommodate future electrical needs.
- Follow Electrical Codes:** Adhere to local regulations such as NEC or British Standards to ensure safety and c...
