

How to connect fiber optic cable into the fiber optic box

- Organize excess cable inside the box, coiling it neatly to prevent tangling and maintain signal integrity.

Testing and Maintenance

- Test the connection using a fiber optic power meter or network tester to verify signal strength and quality.
- Check for loose or misaligned connections and adjust if necessary.
- Schedule regular maintenance to clean connectors and inspect cables for wear or damage.
