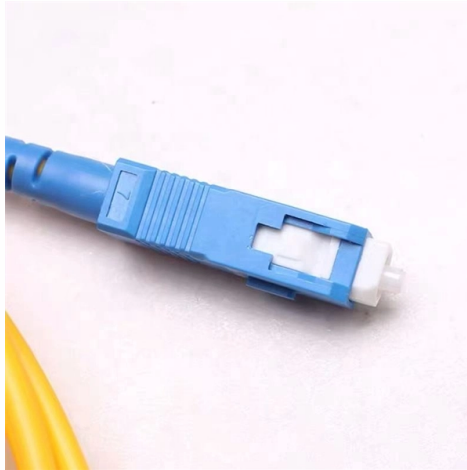


How to detect fiber optic cable line markings



Overview

Use color coding for fiber types to quickly identify cables. Yellow indicates single-mode fiber, while orange and aqua mark multimode fibers. Follow TIA-606-B standards for labeling. We brought the cable back to our office with the intention of opening it. The printings on the fiber optic cable jacket are the markings on the cable's outer layer that provide essential information about its specifications and applications. Misidentification can cause downtime, disrupt essential services, and create safety hazards in data centers. These markers could be small metal or plastic tags attached to the cables or printed labels. Per TIA/EIA standards, the following color coding applies for non-military fiber optic installations: Multimode OM1 = Orange or Slate (Watch for this! OM1 is not compatible with connectors for OM2/OM3/OM4) However: Per TIA 598-C, it is permissible to use different jacket colors as long as the cable.
