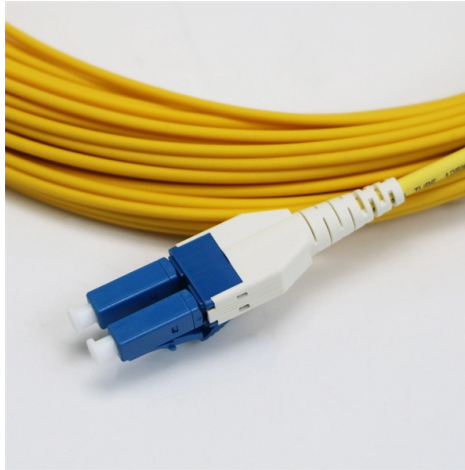

- Overload:** Occurs when the total current exceeds the breaker's rating. Test by unplugging devices and resetting the breaker. Gradually plug in devices to identify the one causing the overload.
- Short Circuit:** Happens when a hot wire touches a neutral or ground wire. Signs include immediate tripping, sparks, or a burning smell. Test by unplugging all devices and resetting the breaker; if it trips again, inspect wiring or outlets.
- Ground Fault:** Current leaks to ground, often due to damaged insulation or moisture. This is dangerous to test yourself and usually requires a professional.

- Set the multimeter to AC voltage.
- Place the black probe on the neutral o...
