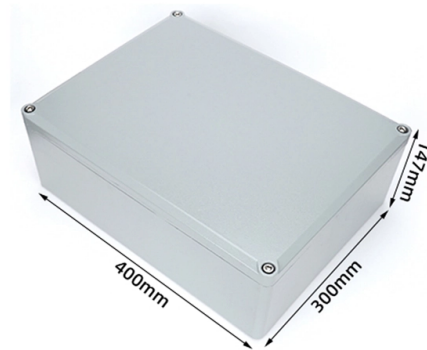


How to fix fiber optic cables and routers

Step 4: Cleaving and Splicing
Cleaving: Use a high-precision cleaver to create a smooth, perpendicular end-face on each fiber. This is critical for low-loss connections.
Splicing Options:
Mechanical Splicing: Align fibers in a connector that holds them in place. Quick and suitable for temporary or field repairs.
Fusion Splicing: Welds the fibers together using heat, providing a permanent, low-loss connection ideal for long-term use.

Step 5: Testing and Protection After splicing, test the connection with an OTDR or power meter to ensure minimal signal loss.
