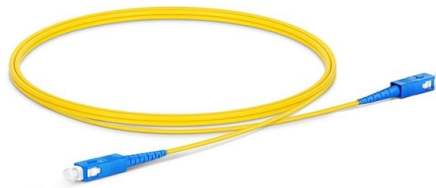


How to insert the network cable into the cold connector
