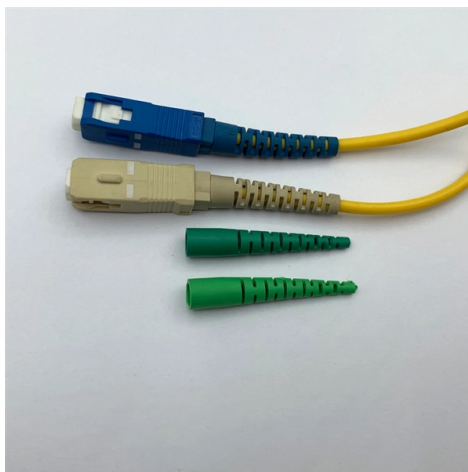


How to install fiber optic cables in a network cabinet
