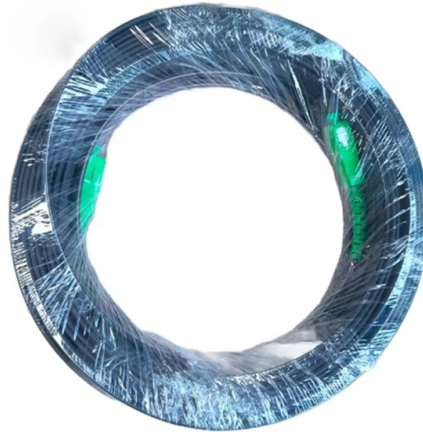


How to separate optical cables when laying them in the same trench

Handling and Installation Tips Respect the minimum bending radius of the optical cable to prevent signal loss or damage (). For longer distances, consider blowing the cable through ducts using compressed air to minimize strain (). Test the cable after installation using an Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) to check for signal loss or installation errors ().
