

# Internal and external network merging access switch

- Combine Internal and External Switches via NIC Teaming or Routing:** Create an internal switch for VM-to-host communication. Use the host as a router or bridge between the internal and external networks, allowing VMs on the internal switch to access external resources. This setup may require configuring IP addresses and routing rules on both the host and VMs.
- Single External Switch with VLANs (Optional):** If your network supports VLAN tagging, you can configure a single external switch with multiple VLANs to separate host and VM traffic logically while maintaining external connectivity.

**Best Practices**

- Dedicated NICs:** Use separate physical NICs for external and internal traffic to prevent bottlenecks and connectivity issues.
- IP Configuration:** Assign static IPs or ensure DHCP is properly configured to avoid conflicts between host and VM networks.
- Security Considerations:** Limit VM exposure to the external network if sensitive data is involved.
