

Is it necessary to use fiber optic cables for home routers

Fiber-Ready Routers and Direct Fiber Connections Some modern routers include SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) ports or are labeled as "fiber-ready," allowing them to accept fiber connections directly without a separate ONT. These routers are less common in typical home setups and are usually higher-end models designed for gigabit or multi-gigabit speeds. In most residential installations, the ONT remains necessary. Connecting Fiber to Your Home Network Fiber Drop to ONT: The ISP runs a fiber cable to your home and connects it to the ONT. ONT to Router: Use a high-speed Ethernet cable (CAT6 or better) to connect the ONT's Ethernet port to your router's WAN port. Router Configuration: Power on the router and configure it as usual to distribute Wi-Fi or wired connections to your devices. In some cases, ISPs provide a combo device that integrates both the ONT and router, simplifying the setup. For larger homes, mesh...
