Use a volt meter to measure voltage at the power supply and at the power distribution box. Long cable runs can result in a voltage drop, which can be solved by using a heavy gauge wire. Side tester (\$10-20 at a hardware store), it's not full proof so it shouldn't be fully relied upon, but is usually enough to tell you if it's energized or not. Multi-meter/volt meter (\$20-100's), requires you to touch the leads to the actual bare wires, risk of shock if you don't know what you're.
