

Must cables in underground parking garages be installed in cable trays

Cables in underground parking garages are not strictly required to be installed in cable trays; they can also be installed in conduits such as threaded rigid metal or intermediate metal conduit according to NEC standards. Only conductors rated for open-air environments, such as Tray Rated (Type TC) or Metal-Clad (Type MC) cables, should be used in trays, and proper clearances and fill limits must be maintained . Cable trays are prohibited in enclosed spaces or hoistways and must remain accessible . For underground wiring specifically, NEC Section 511.8 requires that cables below Class I locations in commercial garages be installed in threaded rigid metal conduit or intermediate metal conduit. Exceptions allow PVC, RTRC, or HDPE conduits if buried under at least 600 mm (2 ft) of cover, but the last 600 mm of the run must use metal conduit with an equipment grounding conductor . This indicates that cable trays are not mandatory for underground runs, and conduits are the standard method for buried or hazardous locations.
