

No lights on the fiber optic switch

If the switch supports diagnostic commands, verify the SFP status and optical power levels.

Step 5: Additional Considerations Ensure both ends of the fiber link use the same fiber type (SMF or MMF) and compatible SFPs. Check for environmental factors such as temperature extremes or moisture ingress that may affect the fiber. If all else fails, test the fiber with a known-good switch or patch cable to isolate the issue. By systematically following these steps—physical inspection, SFP verification, polarity correction, and signal testing—you can usually restore the link and get the switch lights active again.
