Secondary Distribution Boxes Secondary distribution boxes (also called final distribution boards or DBs) receive power from the MDB or sub-main distribution boards (SMDBs) and distribute it to individual circuits for lighting, appliances, or machinery. They typically include busbars, fuses or miniature circuit breakers (MCBs), switches, and optional residual current devices (RCCBs/RBOs). These boxes improve safety by isolating circuits, preventing overloads, and enabling easier maintenance.

Primary and Secondary Distribution Systems In North Asia, electrical distribution follows a primary-to-secondary hierarchy. Primary distribution lines carry medium voltage (typically 5–35 kV) from substations to distribution transformers. Secondary distribution lines then step down the voltage to low levels (100–240 V AC) suitable for end users. Secondary networks may use single-phase or three-phase connections, depending on load requirements, and can be overhead or underground.
