- Chassis Grounding:** Ensure the router chassis is properly grounded according to manufacturer instructions.

Clearance and Airflow

- Leave at least 50 mm (2 inches) around the router for heat dissipation.
- If installing multiple routers, maintain at least 1 U (44.45 mm) of space between units and ensure all routers have the same airflow direction.
- Avoid placing the router next to equipment that exhausts hot air directly into its intake.

Cable Management

- Use cable management brackets to organize power and network cables, preventing strain on connectors and allowing easy access for maintenance.
