- Vertical Bends (Risers):** Pre-fabricated fittings that allow the tray to change elevation while maintaining proper cable support. They are available in various angles (e.g., 30°, 45°, 90°) to accommodate different building layouts.
- Tee and Cross Fittings:** Used when a vertical tray needs to branch off to multiple directions, combining horizontal and vertical routing in one junction.
- Reducers:** When connecting trays of different widths during vertical transitions, reducers ensure a smooth and secure connection while maintaining cable support.
