

Redirecting China Unicom fiber optic cable routes



AI Overview

China Unicom is expanding and redirecting its fiber optic network through major undersea and terrestrial projects, including the EMA undersea cable and the ERM C Eurasia terrestrial route. Undersea Cable Projects China Unicom, along with other Chinese state-owned telecom companies, is a key participant in the EMA (Europe-Middle East-Asia) undersea cable network, a \$500 million project led by HMN Technologies. The EMA cable will connect Hong Kong, Hainan, Singapore, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, and France, providing China-backed international connectivity independent of U.S.-influenced routes. This project is part of China's strategy to secure global data transmission channels and reduce reliance on U.S.-backed cables, potentially creating a divided global internet infrastructure with separate Chinese and American networks. The EMA cable is expected to be operational by 2025. Chinese companies, including HMN Tech and FiberHome Marine Network Equipment, have become major players in submarine cable construction, with cumulative installations exceeding 100,000 km worldwide. These undersea cables are critical for global data traffic, carrying approximately 99% of international data and supporting digital economy growth, AI, cloud computing, and e-commerce in connected regions.

Terrestrial Cable Routes China Unicom also operates terrestrial fiber optic routes, notably the ERM C (Europe-Russia-Mongolia-China) system, which connects Europe to China via Russia and Mongolia. The ERM C runs along the Mongolia Railway, with parallel optical cable routes of about 1,000 km each, linking southern and northern Mongolia through Sukhbaatar, Darkhan, Ulaanbaatar, Choir, and Zamyin Uud. This terrestrial network supports 100 Gbps DWDM transmission, offering a low-latency route from Hong Kong to Frankfurt (146 ms), and integrates OTN networks with RO...
