Compliance with NEC and OSHA standards ensures safe operation on construction or industrial sites.

Mobility and Mounting: Units can be skid-mounted, stationary, or on two- or four-wheeled carts for portability. Modular and pluggable components allow quick assembly and dismantling, which is ideal for temporary or changing jobsite locations.

Capacity and Load Management: Choose a box rated for the total amperage of all welders and auxiliary equipment. Some units, like the Southwire Welding Station, provide 9 kVA capacity with multiple 5-20 duplex outlets, suitable for small to medium welding operations.
