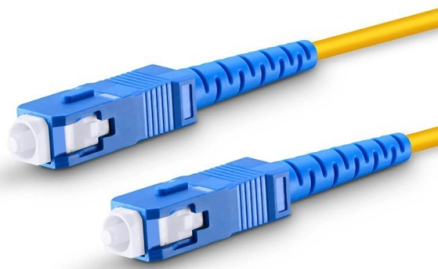


Safety warning signs for cable trays



AI Overview

Cable trays containing conductors over 600 volts must display permanent, legible “DANGER — HIGH VOLTAGE — KEEP AWAY” signs at intervals not exceeding 10 feet. NEC Requirements According to NEC 392.18(H), any cable tray carrying conductors rated over 600 volts must have a permanent, legible warning notice stating: “DANGER — HIGH VOLTAGE — KEEP AWAY” . These signs must be placed in readily visible positions along the tray, with a maximum spacing of 3 meters (10 feet). The labels must comply with NEC 110.21(B), which specifies that hazard markings should use effective words, colors, and symbols, and cannot be handwritten except for variable information . ANSI Z535.4-2011 provides additional guidance on font, color, and symbol usage for safety labels. Placement and Accessibility Warning signs should be installed where they are easily seen by personnel. An exception exists for inaccessible equipment in industrial settings where only qualified personnel service the installation; in such cases, signs should be placed where necessary to ensure safe maintenance and operation . Proper placement helps prevent accidental contact with high-voltage conductors and ensures compliance with safety regulations. Safety Considerations Cable trays can pose hazards such as electric shock, arc flash, or fire if overloaded or improperly maintained . Warning signs are part of a broader safety strategy that includes: Ensuring proper cable fill and spacing according to manufacturer and NEC specifications Using mechanically strong and durable trays to prevent collapse Regular inspection and maintenance to avoid overheating or arcing Label Types and Materials Manufacturers provide durable, chemical- and UV-resistant labels suitable for indoor and outdoor use.
