

Simple Method for Placing Pigtail Cables in the Computer Room

Step 3: Plan Cable Routing Map out the cable paths in your computer room. Avoid running cables across the floor; instead, attach them to walls, furniture sides, or under desks using cable clips, hooks, or adhesive mounts. For power strips, mount them in a centralized, accessible location and route cables through clips to keep them organized.

Step 4: Bundle and Secure Cables Use Velcro straps or zip ties to bundle cables together, separating power and data lines to reduce interference. Keep excess cable length coiled neatly behind equipment or inside cable management channels. If a cable must cross the floor, use a cable protector to prevent damage and tripping hazards.

Step 5: Final Check After all connections and routing are complete, verify that all devices function properly. Ensure cables are not pinched, overly bent, or under tension, and that airflow around equipment is not obstructed
