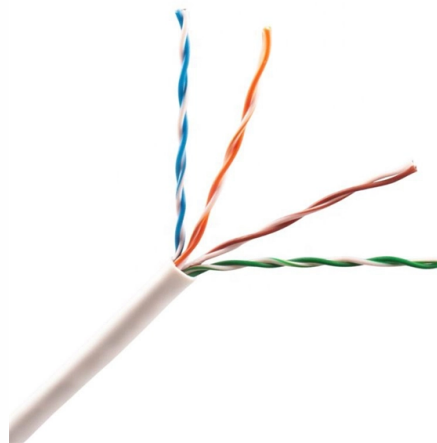

Installation Guidelines When installing an optical module directly into a switch: Ensure the module is correctly oriented and gently insert it into the switch port until it clicks. Do not force the module; if it does not fit, rotate it 180 degrees and try again. Keep dust plugs on unused ports and remove them only when connecting fibers. Use ESD protection, such as wrist straps or gloves, to prevent static damage. Never look directly into the optical module or fiber ends, as they emit laser radiation that can cause eye injury. Supported Transceivers Switches support specific SFP or SFP+ transceivers depending on speed and fiber type. For example, Cisco Small Business switches support: GE SFP (1000 Mbps): MGBSX1 for multimode fiber, 850 nm wavelength, up to 550 m. XG SFP+ (10,000 Mbps): Various transceivers and direct attach copper (DAC) cables. Monitoring and Management Once the optical module is installed and the fiber connected, the switch can provide status information: Using the switch console, commands like `show fiber-ports-optical-transceiver` display operational details. Web-based utilities allow viewing port number, transceiver description, serial number, VLAN ID, temperature, and voltage.
