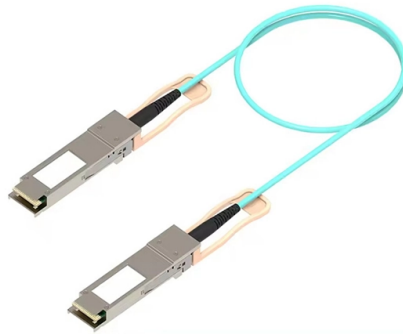

This type is ideal for sensitive signal cables, such as fiber optic or telecommunication cables, and provides shielding from electromagnetic interference (EMI) and radio frequency interference (RFI). Solid-bottom trays are less ventilated, so they are generally not used for high-current power cables.
