Proper support is essential to prevent mechanical strain, maintain alignment, and ensure fire safety. Supports are classified as vertical (suspending trays from ceilings or walls) and horizontal (spanning along the tray length to prevent sagging) and must be selected based on tray type, load, and installation environment .Vertical Supports Vertical supports are used to suspend cable trays from ceilings or attach them to walls. Common types include: Threaded Rods with Ceiling Brackets: M10 threaded rods can be anchored directly to ceilings or via ceiling brackets (e.g., DBG 12) to suspend trays .Pendant Brackets: TKS, HUF, or HDUF brackets allow ceiling suspension with lengths up to 1500 mm, providing flexibility for height adjustments .Wall-Mounted Cantilever Brackets: KTA, KTAF, or KTUG brackets support trays from walls, sometimes without additional threaded rods, suitable for horizontal runs along walls .Spacer Reinforcements: U-profiles or head plates can stiffen the back of brackets to handle heavier loads or longer spans . Vertical supports must be installed near joints and changes in direction (≤ 150 mm) to maintain structural integrity .Horizontal Supports Horizontal supports prevent sagging and distribute the weight of cables along the tray. Key considerations include: Support Spacing: Determined by tray type, width, and load. For example, ladder trays or mesh trays require supports at intervals that prevent excessive deflection .Load Class Consideration: The tray's load rating (Load Class) affects the maximum allowable span between supports .Intermediate Supports: Cantilever brackets or channel sup...
