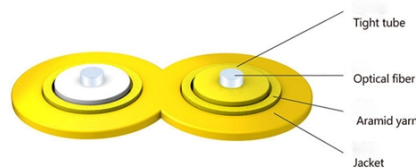


What are the safety precautions for fiber optic cable lines

Never look into the end of a fiber or connector without proper laser safety equipment. Use laser-rated eye protection and follow manufacturer guidelines for splicing or testing equipment.

Chemical Precautions Installation and splicing often involve chemicals for cleaning, stripping, or sealing. These can irritate skin, eyes, or respiratory systems. Always use gloves, safety goggles, and adequate ventilation, and follow the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) instructions for each chemical. Avoid open flames or sparks near flammable compounds.
