Shelves and Brackets: Non-rack-mountable devices can be placed on shelves or secured with brackets, allowing flexible equipment installation.

Cable Management: Integrated trays, vertical organizers, and labeling systems prevent tangled cables, simplify maintenance, and improve airflow.

Cooling and Airflow: Racks are designed to optimize airflow, often with ventilation holes, built-in fans, or integration with data center cooling systems to maintain stable operating temperatures.
