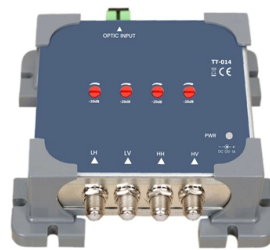

- Main breaker:** Controls the entire electrical supply to the building and can be an MCCB for high-current systems or an MCB for smaller installations.

- Bus bars:** Conduct electricity to multiple circuits.
- Residual current devices (RCCB/RCBO):** Detect leakage currents and prevent electric shocks.
- Surge protective devices (SPD):** Protect equipment from voltage spikes.
