

What router should I use to connect the fiber optic patch cord

.Fiber Patch Cord Details
Fiber patch cords are short, flexible cables with connectors like LC, SC, or ST on each end. They transmit data at high speeds (up to 10 Gbps over short distances) with minimal signal loss. Single-mode cords are typically used for longer distances, while multi-mode cords are suitable for shorter, high-speed connections.
