When cable trays pass through walls or floors, seal openings using fire-rated penetration sealing materials. Do not modify or damage the tray coating or structure during use. Coordinate with Building Structure: Cable tray routing should align with architectural design, avoiding unnecessary crossings, detours, or overlaps with other pipelines. Pair trays with low-smoke, halogen-free cables in occupant areas to reduce toxic fumes. Use fire barriers, covers, and dividers to. Plenum and riser-rated jackets are designed to limit flame spread and smoke generation in the event of a fire, but they serve different purposes based on where the cables are installed. Plenum-rated (OFNP) fiber cables are made for air-handling spaces, such as above suspended ceilings or below. You must firestop optical fiber cables and raceways if you install them through fire-resistant rated walls, partitions, floors, or ceilings, to avoid substantially increasing the possible spread of fire or products of combustion. Materials like steel, aluminum, and fiber-reinforced plastics all behave differently in the presence of fire, so understanding. These indoor fiber optic cables are used exclusively within buildings and must have a flame-retardant cable jacket to fit this purpose. Flame resistant cable may be deployed in-duct (conduit) or cable tray.
