This setup allows a single OLT port to support multiple ONTs, typically with split ratios ranging from 1:32 up to 1:128 depending on the PON standard. Customer Premises In some cases, OLTs are placed directly at customer premises, such as in hotels, apartment complexes, or office buildings. This is more common in localized networks where the OLT serves a smaller number of ONTs with...
